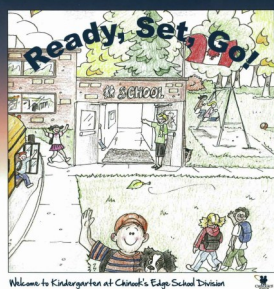

School Absences

* There is no parking or drop-off in the staff lot or bus lane.

* You may drop off your child in the visitor parking lot (south side of the staff lot and chain link fence), the old High School parking lot, or on 23rd Street. Please remember: use the crosswalks and DO NOT park along the yellow curbs. This is a ticketable offence!

When exiting the visitor parking lot, you may only turn right onto 23rd Street between the hours of 8:25 to 8:45 a.m. and 3:15 to 3:45 p.m.

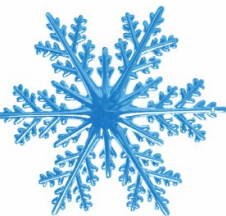
As you might imagine, the students as a whole are vi-




brating with excitement about the holiday. You need to know that they, and the staff, have worked very hard to this point and they deserve the break.
