Board Chair Message

Assessing our impact on student success

Greetings from the Chinook's Edge Board of Education! This month's newsletter theme of 'Assessment' provides the perfect opportunity for our Board to share our pride for the great accomplishments of our students.

We measure student success in a number of ways in Chinook's Edge. This includes test scores, of course, but it also includes information about whether our students are reading at grade level, if they feel safe at school, and if they feel ready to continue striving toward their goals af-

ter graduation. From the increasing number of students attaining acceptable standards on Provincial Achievement Tests to the rising number who achieve Excellence on Diploma Exams, Chinook's Edge is seeing a notable upward momentum and is above provincial average in many measures. Our three-year high school completion rates remain well above provincial average at 81 percent, and there is significant improvement in the number of our graduates who transition to post-secondary learning.

Our Accountability Pillar Report from Alberta Education reflects the efforts and priori-

ties across our entire division, and the Board is equally proud of the continued measure of excellence throughout all safe and caring measures on the Report. We truly believe that relationships matter across all levels in Chinook's Edge. We know that the strength in these relationships leads to success for every student – and for everyone who works alongside them each day in our school communities.

As classrooms move from February into March, the school tends to get a little busier - especially as we get closer to the day report cards go home. Now I can assure you, your child's classroom teacher knows your child as a learner very well and makes plans daily to meet their needs.

That said, the day-to-day work we normally do shifts a little as

we will take the time to do a double check. These checks make sure, at this moment in time, we know exactly how your child is doing compared to the Alberta curriculum. As well, our teachers work exceptionally hard to ensure that your child's indicator (M, MS, E, or Ed) in one classroom would be the same in any of the other grade's classrooms.

We are very careful about our assessments, whether they are for day-to-day work or for these double checks at this time of the year. When you see the report cards later this month, you can be confident in the hard and careful work done by your child and their teacher to get it there.
